What is the Kinnections Program at UNYA?

The Kinnections Program connects Indigenous youth, ages 16-19, with volunteer mentors. Youth needs to meet with their mentor once per week, for a minimum of one year. Youth remain active in the program until they turn 20 years old.

Our goal is to provide youth with life skills training, in hopes that these skills will assist youth with their transition into adulthood.

Youth set their own goals and volunteer mentors assist youth to achieve these goals. Example of youth goals:

- Explore life skills programs
- Job search
- Housing search
- Apply to postsecondary
- Being active
- Community connection
